3 NATIONS CUP – Regulations 2026

1 Introduction

The 3 Nations Cup is a series of mountain bike competitions which are held in Belgium, Netherlands and Germany.

Underneath mentioned competitions will be part of 3 Nations Cup 2026:

2 Participants and categories

2.1 Masters

Since 2020 the UCI has shifted the age with 5 years up starting from 35 and defined international champion ships to be organized in 5-year age groups: 35-39, 40-44, etc. In follow up Belgium did too.

Germany and The Netherlands did not change these categories and retained the old ranges (30-39, 40-49 etc.)

Remark Netherlands has no races for Masters 30-39.

To cope with this the races will be organized as per national rules. In overview:

Check the technical guide and program for details on each race.

The master classes start in a block, together with the amateur classes in the Netherlands and Belgium. (The FUNA driver class starts in Germany together with the fun classes).

The overall ranking in the master and amateur classes (NL, B) is evaluated in the following age groups:

The starting order of the first race is based on the overall results from the previous year, and the starting order of the following races is based on the order of the overall ranking.

2.2 License holders

A general classification is made for the following categories:

2.3 Not license holder

Each organizer is free to choose whether a competition for non-licensees should be added to the program. Participants must be insured according to the regulations of the area in which the competition is taking place.

3 Applicable regulations - Technical guide

All UCI categories in the competitions mentioned under 2.2 are organized according to the UCI rules. National regulations apply to the other categories under 2.2.

Furthermore, the route classification in connection with safety information for riders, trainers and the jury have to be mentioned. This can be found on the homepage of the 3 Nations Cup at the individual organizers under Track Classification.

The "Final Technical Guide" will be published no later than 2 months before the competition.

4 Classification of the races

All races belonging to the 3 Nations Cup 2026 must be registered in one of the following categories:

- HC;
- Class 1;
- Class 2;

- Class 3; (limited)

5 Points

5.1 Rating

See Appendix 1. The number of points differs depending on the UCI category.

5.2 The general classification

The general classification is based on the diagram "Score 3 Nations Cup 2026", as can be seen in Appendix 1. The points are awarded according to this chart, the nationality of the riders is not relevant. This shows that the 3 Nations Cup can also be won by a riders from a country other than the Netherlands, Belgium or Germany. All results of the competitions will be included. As a result, there are no discounted results.

6 Registration / Log In

The correct registration module is referred to on the website www.3nationscup.eu

In 2026 the registration for all races of the 3 Nations Cup in Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany, will take place only via the website of Time & Voice:

Important is to fulfil the full cycle of subscription and payment.

Only if the full cycle (including payment) is done a confirmation will be displayed on your screen and a confirmation mail will be sent to you shortly after.

Only with this confirmation of the subscription you are allowed to start.

Payment will be done by SEPA direct debit which will occur shortly prior to the race.

Registration is only valid after online registration and payment of the registration fee. In case of non-participation, the riders will not be compensated.

Late-registration on the day of the event is only possible if the late registration fee has been paid in the amount specified on the organizer's website. This additional fee goes to the organizer.

Pre-registration ends Tuesday evening before the race at 11:59 p.m.

You can conform your registration to 1 hour before the start of the respective racing category. Riders who register later will always be placed in the back. This rule does not apply to riders with UCI points who start in a UCI category.

7 Requirements for participation

Riders licensed by the Royal Dutch Cycling Union (KNWU) do not need to obtain permission from the association to take part in the 3 Nations Cup in Belgium and Germany. Riders with a license from the Belgian Cycling, the FCWB (Fédération Cyclisme, Wallonie Bruxelles) and CV (Cycling Vlaanderen) do not need a permit to

participate in the races of the 3 Nations Cup.

Riders with a license from the German Cyclists Association (BDR) do not need an entitlement to participate in the races of the 3 Nations Cup.

The above amounts are maximum rates, an organizer is allowed to reduce them.

9 Starting position in the first race

1. The last published UCI MTB ranking (2025)
2. The 10 best places in the overall ranking of last year's 3-Nations Cup.
For those who place U 17 and U 19, the following applies: the five best in the age group and the five best in the younger age group, the have changed due to their age.
Example: the best 5 from the U 19s of 2025 who will still drive U 19s in 2026, and the best 5 from the U17 of 2025, who will switch to U19 in 2026 due to age.
3. According to a draw
4. The jury chairman may provide a privileged starting position for up to five drivers (not for races in UCI categories). These riders will start from 11th to 15th position.

10 Starting position after the first race

After the first race of the 3 Nations Cup 2026, the starting positions will be determined based on the following guidelines:

1. The last published interim ranking in the UCI MTB ranking
2. The overall ranking in the 3 Nations Cup. In the races in Germany, the overall ranking in the 3 Nations Cup alternating between the overall ranking of the Bundesliga and NRW Cup.
3. According to a draw
4. The jury chairman may provide a privileged starting position for up to five drivers (not for races in UCI categories). These riders will start from 11th to 15th position.

11 Signing the start list

All riders are obliged to sign the start list at the inscription

This list will be used by the call up at the start. Riders who have not signed will not be called and will be lined up behind the starting field.

The signing of the start lists, and the registration of the daily entries can take place at least one hour before the start of the race. With daily entries, these participants always start in the back

in all races (with the exception of the riders in the UCI categories with UCI points). The drawing list is also the starting order. The start list will be used effectively in drawing up the riders at the start grid.

This list is not used in German races.

All participants must register for every race in Germany at the starting number issue/office; those who have a license must provide proof of this there! Anyone who does not register will be placed at the back of the starting grid.

12 Prize money & award ceremony

The organizer is obliged to pay at least the prices according to the prize money schedule published by the UCI and the national associations.

The prize money for the races in Belgium in the Elite and Women Elite categories is paid by the national association by paying into the riders bank account. It is therefore mandatory for the award winners to fill out a form (in the competition office after the race). This can be done up to 60 minutes after the arrival.

The first 3 riders of each category will be honored by a award ceremony. The organizer will announce the time of the award ceremony after the race.

Uncollected prices go back to the organizer and cannot be collected anymore

In Belgium U17 will have prizes in nature, other countries organizer can decide.

The prize money is the minimum prize money. An organizer is allowed to increase the prize money.

13 Race numbers

13.1 Start numbers and shirt number Germany

The start numbers and shirt numbers are supplied by Time & Voice in Germany.

All racers must purchase the starting number for a one-time fee of €5. This start number is valid for the races in Remscheid and Winterberg in 2026 (and also for all races of the German XCO-NRW Cup). If lost, a new number can be purchased at the start number issue.

13.2 Start numbers and shirt number Belgium and the Netherlands

In Belgium and the Netherlands, the start numbers are issued by the KNWU, and riders buy a race number and a back number the first time they participate for € 5, -.

This number applies to the entire 3-Nations Cup. The rider is responsible for the correct use of the handlebars and back number.

When lost or broken a reproduction can be issued at cost of 10 Euros.

14 Transponder

14.1 Time recording Germany

Time recording is done via Time & Voice. The time is recorded by measuring the handlebar number.

14.2 Time recording Belgium and The Netherlands

Time recording is done via MyLaps. The time is recorded by measuring the MyLaps tag. Spare tags will be available at permanence.

Please check before the race if the transponder is there and is still working.

15 Prize money (for general classification)

The total prize money is divided as follows:
